

Course Description

The "9th Annual Focus on Common Movement Disorders Course" for Neurology residents will address resident education in common movement disorders including Parkinson's disease, tremor, dystonia, and spasticity. The course format offers didactic lectures, hands-on workshops, and video case studies. The four lectures will include "Overview of Common Movement Disorders: Dystonia, Parkinson's disease, and Tremor", "Neurotoxin Injection for Cervical Dystonia and Blepharospasm", "Deep Brain Stimulation for Common Movement Disorders", and "Medical Management of Common Movement Disorders." Participants will also complete the following four hands-on workshops: Video Case Studies of Common Movement Disorders, Neurotoxin Injection Training, Deep Brain Stimulation Programming, and Therapies Delivered Via Continuous Pumps for Parkinson's Disease and Spasticity.






Tom Davis, M.D.
