Course Description

The “9th Annual Focus on Common Movement Disorders Course” for Neurology residents will address resident education in common movement disorders including Parkinson’s disease, tremor, dystonia, and spasticity. The course format offers didactic lectures, hands-on workshops, and video case studies. The four lectures will include “Overview of Common Movement Disorders: Dystonia, Parkinson’s disease, and Tremor”, “Neurotoxin Injection for Cervical Dystonia and Blepharospasm”, “Deep Brain Stimulation for Common Movement Disorders”, and “Medical Management of Common Movement Disorders.” Participants will also complete the following four hands-on workshops: Video Case Studies of Common Movement Disorders, Neurotoxin Injection Training, Deep Brain Stimulation Programming, and Therapies Delivered Via Continuous Pumps for Parkinson’s Disease and Spasticity.

Dr. Charles serves as Chief Medical Officer of the Vanderbilt Neuroscience Institute and Professor and Vice-Chairman of Neurology. He also directs the Vanderbilt Movement Disorders Clinic.

Michael Okun, M.D.

University of Florida

Dr. Okun is the Administrative Director and founding Co-director of the UF Center for Movement Disorders and Neurorestoration, Program Director for the Movement Disorders Fellowship (including neurologists, neurosurgeons, psychiatrists), National Medical Director for the National Parkinson Foundation, Medical Advisor to Tyler's Hope for a Dystonia Cure, Co-chair of the Tourette Syndrome Association Medical Advisory Board, and the Adelaide Lackner Professor of Neurology. He has published over 200 peer reviewed articles and his research focus has been on novel aspects of deep brain stimulation.



Tom Davis, M.D.

Vanderbilt University

Dr. Davis is Professor of Neurology and serves as the Chairman of the Division of Movement Disorders. He is also a staff neurologist at the Nashville Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

University of California, San Francisco

Dr. Marks is Professor of Neurology at the University of California, San Francisco and Director of the UCSF/SFVA Movement Disorders Fellowship Program. In the Veterans Health Administration, he holds the national position of Chief of Health Professions Education.
